Mr Jean-Marc Janaillac

Executive Vice President Development – RATP Group, Chief Executive Officer - RATP Development

Born in 1953, Jean-Marc Janaillac is a graduate of the HEC (College of Advanced Commercial Studies) (1975) and a former alumnus of the ENA (1980). After starting his career as a Chief of Staff in the Prefecture, he worked as Chief of Staff to the Secretary of State for Tourism (1983-1984). He subsequently held the post of General Manager of French official tourism services for North America in New York, from 1984 to 1987. At the end of that posting, he was appointed Director General of the Maison de la France (1987-1997), an economic interest grouping that handles the promotion of French tourism abroad. In that capacity, he was a member of the Air France board from 1989 to 1994. In 1997, Jean-Marc Janaillac joined the AOM airline as Executive Vice-President Sales & Marketing before being appointed Chief Operating Officer two years later. He joined the Maeva Group as CEO in 2000 before being appointed to the Chair of the Paris Tourism and Conference Board in 2002. He has been serving as the RATP Group's Executive vice-president for Development and as CEO of RATP Dev since November 2004.

Mr Jean-François Janin

Manager, Intelligent Transport Systems Task Force, French Ministry of Transport

Jean-François Janin is graduate of ParisTech (Ecole Polytechnique in 1972, ENPC in 1974) and of the Institute for Political Sciences of Paris in 1974. He worked for the French Ministries for Environment, Industry and Transport in Paris and Clermont-Ferrand. He was also General Manager of the Chamber of Commerce of Lille for 10 years. As ITS task force manager since 2002, in French Ministry of Transport (General Directorate for Infrastructures, Transport and Sea (DGITM) and Interministerial Delegation for Road Safety), he played a major role in the implementation of several ITS systems such as smart cards in public transport, digital tachograph (with responsibilities both at national and European level), automatic speed limits enforcement, national ITS architecture, multimodal travel information and tracking and tracing of dangerous goods.

Jean-François also teaches ITS in ParisTech – ENPC, University Paris II, and ECE. He represents the French Ministry of Transport in ERTICO and is involved in several cooperation agreements with America, Japan and China.

Mr Gabriel Colceag

Vice President, Rail Signalling for Urban Lines THALES

Gabriel is a top graduate of the Aeronautical Faculty of the Polytechnic Institute of Bucharest. He started his career as an aerospace engineer specialising in avionics, flight control systems and communications, holding progressively senior positions with Alcatel-Bell Space and Honeywell. From 1996 to 2001, he joined the Transport Solutions division of Alcatel in Canada, running several Engineering and Safety departments. From 2002 to 2004, Gabriel was based in Paris and he managed the worldwide product portfolio and R&D activities for both main line and urban rail signalling. From 2004 to 2007, he returned to Toronto, Canada and became Vice President of Alcatel Transport Solutions Inc., in charge of new technology projects for major operators of CBTC systems around the world. From 2007 to 2010, he was General Manager of Thales Rail Signalling and Thales Country Director for Romania. Since March 2010, he has been Vice-President of Thales in charge of the Urban Rail Signalling business line of the Transport Systems Division.

Mr Mohamad Nur Ismal Kamal

Chief Executive Officer, Land Public Transport Commission (SPAD)

Mohamad Nur was appointed Chief Executive Officer of the Land Public Transport Commission on June 3, 2010. He started his career as a Senior Financial Analyst with CNA Financial Corp in Chicago, Illinois. After receiving an MBA with distinction from the Kellogg Graduate School of Management, he joined AT Kearney Inc, a top-tier global management consultancy headquartered in Chicago, as an Associate.

After living in the United States for 14 years, he moved back to Kuala Lumpur with AT Kearney serving clients in Singapore, Thailand, Hong Kong, and Australia. In 2001, he joined Accenture as Manager of Strategy and Business Architecture group.

Between 2003 and 2006, Mohamad Nur was a Senior General Manager of DRB-HICOM Berhad and served as a member of the board of directors of DRB-HICOM Information Technologies Sdn Bhd. Between 2007 and 2008, Mohamad Nur was a Deputy Director at the Ministry of Higher Education. At the ministry, he assisted in the preparation of the ministry's strategic plan and led various teams to develop the critically acclaimed National Higher Education Action Plan.
